# **Problem Background**

- Increased pressure on the worker → More work-related injuries.
- Variety of injuries: chemical, musculoskeletal, respiratory, and violence
- Lack of proper training
- Culture of blaming the worker.



### **Objectives**

 Identify the major health and safety risks faced by NYCHA workers, across all major occupational categories

Develop materials that will be used by Safety Associates and NYCHA workers to identify hazards and prevention measures

 Pilot test materials to evaluate effectiveness

- Caretaker J at Albany Houses, Brooklyn
  - "Treated like a slave"
  - "Not treated with respect"
  - Work complaints that were reported two years ago still weren't fixed
- Shop Steward at Albany Houses, Brooklyn
  - "I take pride in my building."






